March 19, 2013

Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 59.11, the March 19, 2013 session of the Sheboygan County Board was called to order by Chairperson Roger L. Te Stroete at 6:00 p.m. Chairperson Te Stroete noted that the notice of meeting was posted on March 13, 2013 at 2:15 p.m. in compliance with the open meeting law. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance by all present.

The roll call was taken and recorded with 23 Supervisors present; Absent: 2, Supervisors Baumgart, and Ogea.



SHEBOYGAN COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 29 (2012/13)

Re: Supporting Petition of Towns of Sherman and Holland to Public Service Commission for Emergency Rules Relating to Wind Farms

WHEREAS, developers are in the process of attaining approvals to build industrial wind farms in Sheboygan County, and

WHEREAS, citizens living next to industrial wind turbines have made claims of suffering health issues potentially caused by low frequency noise and infrasound generated by wind turbines, and

WHEREAS, a report (Report #122412-1) released December 28, 2012, to the Wisconsin Public Service Commission by four acoustical consulting firms states that low frequency noise and infrasound created by wind turbines in the Shirley Wind Farm in Denmark, Wisconsin, exists in some homes surrounding the wind farm, and

WHEREAS, the report recommended additional study on an urgent priority basis, specifically:

- A comprehensive literature search far beyond the search performed under time constraints of the initial report;
- A re-test at Shirley to determine the decay rate of ultralow frequency wind turbine sound with distance with a more portable system for measuring simultaneously at the three homes and at other locations;
- A "Threshold of Perception" test with participating and non-participating Shirley residents:

and

WHEREAS, in part based on the report, the Public Service Commission, on February 17, 2013, denied a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity for the Highland Wind Farm project in St. Croix County (Docket #2535-CE-100), and

WHEREAS, the same issues with respect to the effect of low frequency noise and infrasound on public health and safety concern the Town Boards of Sherman and Holland in Sheboygan County as those Boards consider the application for the proposed Windy Acres Wind Farm project in those townships, and

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2013, the Towns of Sherman and Holland petitioned the Public Service Commission for an Emergency Rule allowing municipalities to decline to approve PSC 128 applications for completeness until the PSC establishes low frequency noise/infrasound and noise modeling benchmarks for the municipalities to use in measuring application completeness, and

WHEREAS, the Sheboygan County Board agrees with the Town Boards of Sherman and Holland that the health and safety of the public require the establishment of benchmarks for

low frequency noise/infrasound and noise modeling measurements for municipalities to use in determining application completeness, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sheboygan County Board supports the establishment of emergency PSC rules as requested in the Petition of the Towns of Sherman and Holland and directs the County Clerk to forward copies of the herein Resolution to the Public Service Commission, state legislative representatives having constituencies in Sheboygan County, and such other public officials as the Clerk may deem appropriate.

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 31 (2012/13)

Re: Requesting Legislature to Amend Wisconsin's Public Records Law to Permit a Municipality to Impose Fees for Actual Expenses Incurred in Necessary Redacting

WHEREAS, Section 19.35 of Wisconsin's Public Records Law states in pertinent part that unless "otherwise provided by law or as authorized to be prescribed by law, an authority may impose a fee upon a requester for "locating a record, not exceeding the actual, necessary and direct cost of location, if the cost is \$50 or more" (emphasis added), and

WHEREAS, in the recent Wisconsin Supreme Court decision entitled *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel v. City of Milwaukee*, Case No. 2012 WI 65, the Court held that an authority can only charge for the four enumerated tasks set forth within § 19.35(3), the aforementioned "location cost" being one of them, and

WHEREAS, the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel Court further held that a "location cost" does not include the actual cost of staff time and materials expended to redact information from a voluminous open records request, specifically stating that had the legislature "intended to allow an authority to recoup all of its actual costs, it could have simply said so rather than delineate four specific tasks for which fees may be imposed in Wis. Stat. § 19.35(3)," and

WHEREAS, dicta from four of the Justices to the *Milwaukee Journal Sentinel* decision recognized that Wisconsin's Public Records Law needs legislative re-examination, and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain the underlying spirit of Wisconsin's Public Records Law, while avoiding the undue economic burden that municipalities will to suffer if they are unable to recoup any of the costs associated with necessary redacting, it is imperative that the State Legislature amend Wis. Stat. § 19.35(3) to include a provision that permits an authority to impose fees for the actual labor and material costs it incurs in accommodating public records requests to inspect and/or hand-count election ballots.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Sheboygan County Board of Supervisors hereby urges the Governor and the State Legislature to amend Wis. Stat. § 19.35(3) to include a provision that permits a municipality to impose fees for the actual labor and material costs it incurs in necessary redacting required to fulfill any public records request.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Clerk is directed to forward copies of the herein Resolution to the Governor, state legislative representatives having constituencies in
