Te Stroete at 6:00 p.m. Chairperson Te Stroete noted that the notice of meeting was posted on June 12, 2013 at 2:15 p.m. in compliance with the open meeting law. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance by all present.

The roll call was taken and recorded with 24 Supervisors present; Absent: 1, Supervisor Weggeman.

Supervisor Winkel made a motion for approval of the May 21, 2013 Journal, which was distributed to all supervisors prior to the meeting. The motion was seconded by Supervisor LeMahieu and carried on unanimous roll call vote of the board.

# SHEBOYGAN COUNTY ORDINANCE NO. 05 (2013/14)

Re: Amending County Employee Grievance Procedure

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to the requirements of Wis. Stat. § 66.0509(1)(m), the Sheboygan County Board enacted Ordinance No. 6 (2011/12) on November 1, 2011, creating a County Employee Grievance Procedure, and

**WHEREAS**, in reviewing the procedure, the Human Resources Committee has determined that there are areas where the procedure can be clarified and can provide the potential for a more even-handled approach to discipline than the original language of the Ordinance, and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interests of Sheboygan County to amend the County Employee Grievance Procedure Ordinance to incorporate those provisions.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows:

Section 1. <u>Amending Order of Business as to Grievance Procedure</u>. Section 2.04(2) of the Sheboygan County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows (additions indicated by redlining; deletions by strike-through):

- 2.04(2) The order of business for all other meetings except the budget review session, special sessions, and the Organizational Meeting shall be as follows:
  - (a) Call to order.
  - (b) Certification of compliance with Open Meeting Law.
  - (c) Pledge of Allegiance.

  - (f) Committee and other appointments.
  - (g) Presentations.
  - (h) Public Addresses to the Board.
  - (i) Letters, Communications, and Announcements.
  - (j) County Administrator's report.
  - (k) Public Hearings.
  - (I) Reports of Committees on referrals of Resolutions and Ordinances and action thereon in the following order:
    - Executive Committee.
    - 2. Other standing committees in alphabetical order.
    - 3. Special committees.
  - (m) Elections.
  - (n) Other Committee reports and action thereon, if any.
  - (o) Introduction of Resolutions, discussion, and action thereon. (All new Resolutions referred to Committees shall be read, titles only.)
  - (p) Introduction of Ordinances, discussion, and action thereon. (All new Ordinances referred to Committees shall be read, titles only.)
  - (q) Grievance Appeals required by Section 48.09 of this Code.

48.08(2) The Human Resources Director shall upon receipt of a written hearing request appoint an impartial hearing officerexaminer to hear the matter. The impartial hearing officer shall be selected by the Human Resources Director with the approval of the County Administrator from among the Department Heads but shall not be a person who supervises the employee. Alternatively, in the discretion of the Human Resources Director, with the approval of the County Administrator, the Human Resources Director may select a person who is not affiliated with the County. Alternatively, the impartial hearing examiner may be selected by the Human Resources Director with the approval of the County Administrator from among the Department heads but shall not be a person who supervises the employee.

Section 3. Amending Grievance Procedure. Section 48.08(8) of the Shebovgan County Code of Ordinances are hereby amended as follows (additions indicated by redlining: deletions by strike-through):

(8) The employee has the burden of proof in an employee discipline grievance to show that the County's discipline was arbitrary and capricious and/or that the County did not adhere to the time limits or other grievance process requirements established under this Chapter. The County has the burden of proof in a workplace safety grievance. The standard required of the party with the burden of proof in all cases is a preponderance of the evidence.


Re: Correcting Technical Errors in Code

- **NOW, THEREFORE**, the County Board of Supervisors of the County of Sheboygan does ordain as follows (strikeouts indicate deletions; redlining indicates additions):
  - Section 1. <u>Amending Sections 14.01 and 14.02</u>. Sections 14.01 and 14.02 of the Code of Ordinances are hereby amended to replace references to Wis. Stat. §§ 146.70 and 146.70(3) respectively with Wis. Stat. § 256.35.
  - Section 2. <u>Amending Section 47.02</u>. Section 47.02 of the Code of Ordinances is amended to eliminate the word "Family" from the title of the Family Court Commissioner in Grades 11 and 16.
  - Section 3. <u>Amending Chapter 49</u>. Chapter 49 of the Code of Ordinances is amended to eliminate the word "Family" from the title of the Family Court Commissioner wherever it appears in that Chapter.
  - Section 4. <u>Amending Section 49.04</u>. Section 49.04 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to replace reference to Wis. Stat. § 767.13 with Wis. Stat. § 757.68(2m).
  - Section 5. <u>Amending Section 50.05</u>. Section 50.05 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to replace reference to Wis. Stat. § 66.29 with Wis. Stat. § 59.52(29) and 66.0901
  - Section 6. Repealing Section 56.07. Section 56.07 of the Code of Ordinance is hereby repealed.

Re: Sale of Excess Land in Town of Rhine

WHEREAS, Sheboygan County owns a parcel in the Town of Rhine that was used by the Highway Department and is known as the Jung Pit, and

WHEREAS, the parcel is comprised of approximately 3.7 acres of land not needed for County purposes now or in the foreseeable future, and it would be in the public interest to sell the excess land at fair market value so that it can be returned to the tax roll, and

WHEREAS, the excess land is described as:

Thence S00°08'59"E, along the East line SE ¼ Section 15, 450.00 feet to the point of beginning:
